## Alf Millward & Gwen Gibbs who married 18<sup>th</sup> June 1949

- 2. The bridal car: a grey 1937 Hudson Terraplane\*
  This was hired from Wesley's Garage, Castlethorpe Road (now Faith Terrace), Hanslope. \*A limited number were made in Essex under licence from the Hudson Company in Detroit, USA. They were available from Shaw & Kilburn, car sales of Luton, for the sum of around £285 (nearly £11,000 in today's money). It had "101 smooth horsepower" and could achieve 27mpg!
- 3. Cutting the cake make at Alf and Gwen's reception in Hanslope Village Hall. It was made by Mr Garratt of Newport Road, Hanslope. The Village Hall was first built as a school but closed in 1933 so Gwen went to the other school, known as the 'Bottom School'. Gwen's mother, Katherine Gibbs (nee Herbert), did all the catering for the reception. She was a fine cook and loved it. She ran food canteens before the war at Hanslope Park and then at the air force depot, the 72 Maintenance Unit hidden in the middle of Salcey Forest, close to Hartwell.
